Message From The Rabbi



A few days ago (August 4) I watched Shimon Peres, recently retired President of Israel, interviewed by Chris Matthews. This remarkable 91-year-old man, who has held myriad offices since

the founding of Israel in 1948 (President, Prime Minister, Defense Minister, among other positions), and is a Nobel Peace Prize winner, spoke with quiet eloquence about the justice of Israel's case.

He explained Israel's determination to defend itself against attacks from above and below, from the rockets in the air to the tunnels underground, and her sorrow at having to shoot at buildings and people among whom Hamas has chosen to place its own weapons of destruction.

He talked about Israel's fight not being just against a threat to Israel but a threat to the Arab world as a whole, and indeed our world here in the West. Terror, religious or otherwise, has to be fought, and we have to be able to see through the propaganda that pretends to care for victims of violence, but only advances the cause of terror.

And yet at the same time, what Peres communicated was something in very short supply at the moment—hope. After all that we are seeing in the world, after all that he has seen, he still speaks, calmly, but with passion, about the need for peace in Israel, about the possibility of peace, and steps he would take to bring it about. Is he a dreamer, a fantasist, someone not living in the real world? Some would say so. But I think not. No more a dreamer or fantasist than the founder of Zionism, Theodor Herzl, who wrote a book about a Jewish homeland in Israel at a time when what is now Israel was a small backwater in the large Ottoman Empire and Jews were being kicked, bullied, abused and pogromed in many parts of the world, no more than Chaim Weizmann who talked to the most powerful governments as the representative of a Jewish State that did not exist, no more than thousands upon thousands of foot soldiers for Zionism when Israel was not a dim and distant

possibility, but, according to the realists of the day, a complete and absolute impossibility. And what song did these dreamers, these fantasists sing as their anthem? Hatikvah—The Hope. Julie and I wish you all a Happy and Peaceful New Year of 5775.
